ANNUAL EVENTS

Business Excellence Awards Ceremony

Held in February, the Business Excellence Awards Ceremony celebrates the Chamber's previous year's accomplishments, conducts award presentations and provides members a place to also award and recognize their staff, volunteers and members. This event is a great opportunity for members to tell us about themselves and why they have chosen Monroe as their business base.

Light Up Monroe

Light Up Monroe has grown into a block party style event at Traveler's Park with a Light Show Cruise. LUM is a decades-old holiday tradition of community tree lighting and hometown celebration on the Sunday after Thanksgiving. The Chamber seeks community partners who share our desire for a quality, family-oriented holiday celebration to broaden the depth of meaning of this exciting time of year.

Music in the Park

The Chamber hosts a concert music festival every Friday in July to bring the community together. The Monroe Chamber is proud to organize the Beer Garden and have a lineup of various musical talent along with food trucks and featuring our local craft breweries.

Fair Days Parade and Market

Monroe's favorite summer time tradition kicks off the Evergreen State Fair down the streets of Monroe on the last Saturday in August. Businesses have two opportunities to engage with over 9,000 local residents and guests. The Fair Days Parade is a great way to showcase your business down the streets of Monroe and the Fair Days Market is an opportunity to sell your wares. Registration for the Parade and Market opens in March.

Monroe Farmers Market

Held in May through September every Wednesday. The Monroe Farmers Market is a fun, social event that is open to all. Geared towards farm to table providing fresh produce, products and services to our residents as well as the surrounding areas and tourists. We have our visitor information booth set up at each event and have over 80,000 visitors throughout May to the end of September.

Small Business Saturday

The Monroe Chamber of Commerce works with local businesses to participate in Small Business Saturday sales the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Businesses offer a one day special in honor of this event and the first 50 visitors to come into our Chamber office receive a complimentary reusable tote bag stuffed with our chamber members swag, coupons and information.

MONTHLY EVENTS

Mobile Visitor Center

The Monroe Chamber of Commerce is proud to partner with various businesses to set up a visitor welcome area for our chamber members. We host a 6' table filled with your business information, swag and brochures that the community can have easy access to without coming into our Visitor Center. This helps with exposure for your business while also building partnerships in the community.

Chamber Orientation (quarterly event)

We encourage new Chamber members and those interested in learning more about the Chamber to attend one of our quarterly Chamber Orientation meetings. This is your opportunity to meet the Chamber staff, introduce your business, and familiarize yourself with the variety of benefits we offer and get connected!

Engage Monroe

This informal networking event offers members the opportunity to network, build relationships, and to present information on their business and services or products made. Members exchange business cards with prospective clients and customers. Starting and growing or maintaining business relationships is what these gatherings are focused on. It's the hosts responsibility to provide snacks and drinks for the venue. Hosting an After Hours event is great networking opportunity to invite the business community and organizations to get to know each other and interact.

New business and Resident Mailings

The Chamber mails out informational packages to all new businesses and residents. They contain a welcome letter, advertising, business cards and promotional material from various Chamber members.

Chamber Luncheon (2nd Tuesday of each month)

The Chamber's monthly General Membership Luncheon is an informal opportunity to network with fellow Chamber Members and to hear discussions on topics of interest to the business community. During these luncheons, we also recognize our milestone Member Anniversaries and welcome all New Members.

Published semi-annually, this guide is packed with valuable information about Monroe to assist residents, tourists and guests enjoy all that Monroe has to offer from shopping to dining to outdoor adventures.

Relocation Packet Program (RPP)

This program allows Chamber members to include their valuable business information in the Relocation packet that is mailed to individuals and businesses looking to relocate to Monroe or have moved to Monroe. Various levels of participation are available allowing for different types of promotion material, from business cards to brochures.

Chamber Website

The Chamber website is a resource of interactive information for our members including a member directory, community and Chamber calendars, Member to Member Discounts, job postings, and more. Visitor Information Center

The information display is the main feature in the VIC. Members are able to display their cards and brochures for free. We also acquire your business cards to place at all of our events we host or coordinate with and at our mobile visitor information stations.

Special Event Information Table

All Chamber members are allowed to provide business cards, brochures and other marketing material for our Special Event Information Table. We host an Informational Table at events like Music In The Park, special events at the Fairgrounds and county networking events.

AFFILIATIONS AND PARTNERSHIPS

The Chamber is affiliated with the following organizations and boards:

- **Economic Alliance Snohomish County.** EASC exists to be a catalyst for economic vitality resulting in stronger communities, increased job creation, expanded educational opportunities, and improved infrastructure within Snohomish County. We have joined forces with them to represent Monroe and to grow our professional base within the county.
- Rotary Club of Monroe. The Rotary Club of Monroe is a service organization that helps our city through service projects from fundraising for college scholarships for our local youth community to the creation of an all-weather field built to accommodate those with challenges to providing dinners at our local battered women's shelter to organizing our city's annual Night Out Against Crime. By being a member of this service organization the Chamber is able to give back to our community and help provide for the citizens our city.
- Monroe Kiwanis Club. Being a member of the Kiwanis club is a great way to a be leader and example for our youth community. Business leaders are great mentors and examples for middle school and high school Key Club Members. The Kiwanis is also a wonderful service organization that helps our local food bank, youth community and city.
- Washington Nonprofits. As the state association for all nonprofits, Washington Nonprofits makes sure nonprofits have what they need to succeed. Washington Nonprofits helps nonprofits learn what they need to know to achieve their mission. It increases their influence with policymakers and philanthropy so that they have a place at the table when decisions are made. It connects nonprofits to people and resources so that they can focus on getting the job done.
- City of Monroe Economic Development Advisory Board (Ad-hoc member). The 11-member advisory board will figure out ways to implement ideas that are already a part of Monroe's Downtown Master Plan and Economic Development Plan, which is a standalone plan adopted into Monroe's 2015-2035 Comprehensive Plan. The city's driving document sets six overarching areas of focus for economic development.
- Monroe Boys and Girls Club Advisory Board. The Boys and Girls Club Advisory Board is a great way to stay connected and involved with the youth of our community. The Boys and Girls Club helps us stay connected and learn about different ways to market and promote our local business community to our residents.
- Snohomish County Tourism Bureau. The Chamber attends varies Sky Valley tourism committee meetings such as the River Recreation Coalition. To address the needs of coordinated river recreation and alleviate pressures of a growing recreation population, a coalition formed in October 2015 to develop a concept plan to support well-managed, sustainable recreation. The coalition is comprised of over 25 entities representing federal, tribal, state, and local governments and agencies; businesses; civic groups; nonprofit organizations; and residents.




